Human rights are rights inherent to all human beings, regardless of race, sex, nationality, ethnicity, language, religion, or any other status. Human rights include the right to life and liberty, freedom from slavery and torture, freedom of opinion and expression, the right to work and education, and many more. Everyone is entitled to these rights, without discrimination.

Who does this apply to

What we will do

Our policy commitment means that we will:

- Comply with the laws of Australia with respect to human rights.
- Comply with all United Nations human rights treaties which have been ratified by Australia¹.
- Comply with the guidance of our more experienced and more knowledgeable globally based clients with respect to their policies and procedures related to human rights.
- Not source services, material or equipment from organisations which, directly or indirectly, partake in human rights abuses.

 - work in just and favourable conditions;

Our policy commitment means that we will:

- Engage with our personnel, suppliers and clients to ensure that we are adhering to this policy.
- Terminate any relationships with any individuals, suppliers or clients who are directly, or indirectly, found to be in breach of human rights treaties, conventions and/or laws.
- Be transparent in our dealings with our clients.
- Make decisions and recommendations based on objective, documented criteria.
